

Toolkit for Remote Inclusive Research



It's always important to include people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) on research teams. It's even more important to include people with IDD on research teams during public health emergencies. That's because people with IDD can be most at risk during the emergency. This toolkit gives strategies that research teams can use to work remotely with people with IDD during public health emergencies.

This Toolkit for Remote Inclusive Research:

- Is designed for research team leaders who want to include research team members with IDD
- Includes descriptions of strategies that can be used across different stages of the research process. For each strategy, the toolkit also includes:
 - Accommodations to make sure everyone on the team can participate
 - Adaptations to use strategies during remote collaboration
 - Accessible resources for team members, such as video directions for frequently used technologies and forms that can be individualized for your project
 - Suggestions of free and low-cost technologies that teams can use to collaborate remotely
 - Examples of other research projects that have used each strategy and accommodation

The accessible, HTML toolkit features 23 evidence-based strategies that can support inclusive research, cross-linked with seven phases of the research process. The toolkit operates on any device, and does not require internet access.
